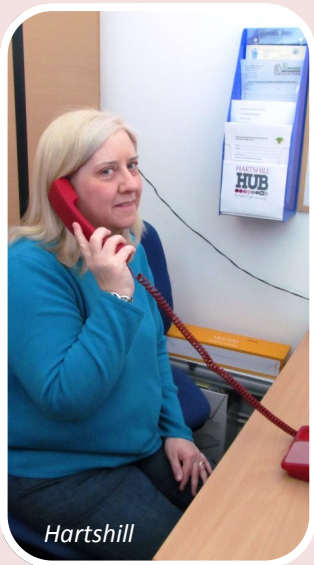
Have You Tried Your Nearest Hub Yet?

Where Are The Hubs?

Hartshill, Mancetter, Coleshill, Arley, Dordon, Baddesley and Kingsbury.



Mini hubs or information points can be found in Polesworth Library, Birchmoor, Coleshill Library, Ansley, Shustoke, Wood End, Water Orton and Atherstone.



Hubs have equipment which you can use to contact North Warwickshire Borough Council and other useful organisations.

The bigger hubs have Video Conferencing where you can speak to someone face to face and scan documents to them there and then.

Some hubs have branched out and have community cafes and libraries, some have formed computer and family history clubs.

Others run fruit and vegetable schemes and arts and crafts groups.



Could You Volunteer In Your Hub?

The hubs rely on local people giving up their free time to open and run them on a weekly basis.

You could be helping someone set up an email account, contacting the council about their benefits or apply for a driving license.

There's also administration, food bank, marketing and event planning opportunities.
